

Pastor John's Reflection



"O give thanks to God, for God is good;
God's steadfast love endures for ever!" - Psalm 118:1

I write this at Thanksgiving time in November as we prepare to share our annual community Thanksgiving meal and worship, and I'm looking back at this past year with deep gratitude to God. I'm grateful for you and for the beautifully diverse community of Peace in the Hilltop. I'm grateful for the ministry we share, walking and working together side by side and seeking to do our part as God's instruments in God's work to love and bless the world. I'm grateful to be your pastor (over 18 years at Peace, in this 25th anniversary year of my ordination), to be welcomed into your lives in vulnerable moments, in times of struggle, sickness, and death, and in moments of

joy, celebration, and new life. I'm grateful for the gift of this summer's sabbatical for rest, renewal, and relationships.

German theologian Meister Eckhart said in the 14th century, "If the only prayer we ever said was 'Thank you,' that would be sufficient." Maybe this is because a grateful person lives life not out of entitlement but from a posture of dependence on God, and that's how God calls us to live. In his book *Giving to God*, Bible scholar Mark Allan Powell says, a grateful person is one who has a deep sense of life as a gift, and so a grateful person appreciates and enjoys life much more than they would otherwise. He shares a story of a child wondering why his family gave thanks for their food at every meal when, as near as he could tell, they would have gotten the food whether they thanked God for it or not. A wise elder of the household tells the child, "It makes everything taste better to be thankful." When we live in gratitude to God, we learn to trust God to provide for our needs, and life is better and more satisfying. The way of gratitude leads to contentment, the remarkable discovery of the apostle Paul who wrote in prison, "I have learned to be content with whatever I have" (Philippians 4:11).

I invite you to enter this Advent and Christmas season with an attitude of gratitude to God—gratitude for what is most important in life—relationships.

- + Gratitude for a relationship with God who has chosen to come to be with us as one of us in Jesus, the incarnate one ("God with skin on"), to meet us where we are in the struggles and joys of our humanity, to know us and love us and save us, to walk with us into the future.
- + Gratitude for relationships with family, friends, community—connections of love and concern and joy and hope. God's love is steadfast and true, and we experience that love often in trusted relationships with one another.
- + Gratitude to be part of a community of faith where relationships with God and with people are nurtured and grown.

This has been an exciting year of ministry together at Peace. Our new 2026 Ministry Plan we will distribute at the annual congregational meeting December 14 will help us celebrate as we share ministry stories of the year. In a time of fear, uncertainty, and challenge in our nation and world, God is faithful, and God has brought us this far by faith! O give thanks to the Lord, for God is good!!

The word gratitude is closely connected to the word grace, which means a free gift from God (of love and forgiveness and life). Have a grateful, grace-filled Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany!

From the Peace Community Center Board of Directors

On Sunday, November 16th Peace Community Center updated the congregation on our strategic planning process through a lunch gathering after the 11 am service. As a Board we have been working for many months on our new direction, and while it has taken longer than any of us expected, we are excited to be at a new stage looking at Peace Community Center's future. It was great to dream with those of you in attendance about



this new future we are collectively building so that Peace Community Center, in partnership with Peace Lutheran Church, can effectively engage and support *Hilltop youth and families to address economic inequities and build housing stability within our community.* While doing this work, we will build upon our four foundational commitments: Centering Community, Faith Mission, Safe Space, and Accountable Partnerships.

As a Board, we met after the luncheon to reflect on the hopes, wonderings, and questions that were shared with us. As we gathered our thoughts, a few key themes stuck out to us:

- the importance of creating safe space where youth and families can be honored as their full selves
- · the passionate ideas for ways we can serve our neighbors with love and dignity
- the need to continue strengthening our capacity to partner with and listen to the community at large, and specifically the young people and families we hope to serve

But even more than that, what brought us deep hope and energy for the work ahead was the number of people who continue to care so deeply about the Community Center and its overarching mission to care for and be in relationship with the Hilltop neighborhood.

The other thing that we heard is that at the lunch gathering is the need to provide more communication and updates on the work, and we are committed to doing that. Our goal, with your insights and questions informing our planning, is to complete the first draft of the strategic plan by the end of this year, and then in the new year to gain feedback from Peace Lutheran Church and key partners. In the first few months of 2026, we will also begin to codify what our partnership with Peace Lutheran Church looks like, and to develop a job description for the next leader of Peace Community Center. From there we will move to the hiring process and the important work of making this new direction a tangible reality.



Children's Ministry

This fall at Peace we've had some wonderful experiences for children.

Every Sunday during the Faith Education Hour at 9:45 am children ages 4 through 3rd grade have a chance to listen to Bible stories come alive through Godly Play, with wondering questions to encourage them in faith and a special response time. Older children 4th-6th grade explore Bible stories and grow in their relationship with God through the Explorers class. Most Sundays during 11 am worship children are invited to share in

Children's Worship Time, a special time of worship for children outside the sanctuary where they hear Bible stories, sing songs of faith, and share in activities and prayer that help them worship God.

We celebrated fall with a wonderful Harvest Fest at the end of October — yummy food, games and crafts, cider-making, face-painting, and fun — and lots of folks came in great costumes!

As we enter the Advent season, we encourage families with children to use the Advent devotional materials in the Advent bags we're providing on Sunday mornings, including the Jesse Tree daily devotions with Advent candles to light and special ornaments to color and display at home. Kids and families, mark your calendars for these special Christmas opportunities:



- Children's Christmas Celebration: Saturday December 13 from 4-6 pm food, Christmas crafts, and the Christmas story, and the opportunity to decorate the Christmas tree and sanctuary.
- Children's Christmas Program: Sunday December 21 during 11 am worship kids dress up in costumes and act out the story of Jesus' birth in worship, with songs and parts spoken by the Explorers class. Other kids who want to participate, come to Peace at 9:30 am that morning to get a costume and join in!
- Children's Christmas Eve Worship: Wednesday December 24 at 5 pm come celebrate Jesus' birth on Christmas Eve with a short worship time (around half hour) geared for children!

Youth Ministry



Dear Peace Family,

As I step into the role of Youth Minister, I am deeply grateful to join a community that so boldly values diversity and seeks justice. For those I haven't yet met over coffee or at the Peace Cafe, I come to this role with a heart for advocacy and a passion for the deep, difficult questions of faith. My background is in immigration advocacy, where I've learned that our beliefs must always lead us to stand with our neighbors. I also bring a love for the "heavy lifting" of theology and philosophy. Whether we are looking at the Old Testament prophets or the writings of modern philosophers, I believe our youth are ready to engage

with big ideas and their big dreams. My hope is to walk alongside them as we explore how the ancient wisdom of scripture speaks to our modern lives here in Tacoma.

Looking Ahead: Building Bridges and Breaking Bread inspired by the "Building Bridges" theme we are seeing in our city's celebrations, my vision for the youth program is one of Radical Connection. I believe our youth group shouldn't be an island, but a hub. Drawing on the idea of "Small World Networks," I hope to connect our students with other groups across the city—including high school philosophy clubs—to foster dialogue that takes their intellect seriously. We will explore how our Lutheran tradition intersects with the wider Christian family, while keeping our bodies firmly planted as the hands and feet of our Savior. Just as we are reflecting this Advent on how Jesus feeds a hungry world, our youth will be putting their faith into action soon! From helping serve our community members in need to sharing stories in the homes of our community members, we will learn that following Jesus means showing up for others. I look forward to growing with you all this season!

My hope is that each of us can find some peace at Peace this Advent. 




Community Engagement & Outreach

As we approach the close of another year, I am filled with deep gratitude for the countless ways our Peace community has continued to serve, uplift, and walk alongside our neighbors. Through compassion, creativity, and collaboration, our ministries have embodied God's call to love and justice, especially through our Peace Affordable Housing Ministry, Peace Café, and community outreach efforts.





The Peace Café has continued to be a beacon of hospitality every week, serving hundreds of hot meals and offering a space of belonging for all who come through our doors. Volunteers, church members, and community partners have come together to prepare, serve, and sit with our guests in genuine fellowship.

Beyond meals, the Café has become a hub for essential items, clothing, hygiene products, and household goods—distributed to those in need. Many of our volunteers have shared how these weekly gatherings remind them of the heart of the Gospel: breaking bread together and seeing Christ in one another.

This year brought renewed partnerships across Tacoma and the Hilltop neighborhood. We strengthened ties with local schools, nonprofits, and neighborhood organizations to ensure that families had access to support services, scholarships, and resources.

Each event reminded us that small acts of generosity, whether a grocery bag, a warm coat, or a listening ear, can change the course of someone's day or even their life.

From direct outreach and prayerful engagement to coordinating temporary shelter and resource navigation, we have sought to respond with empathy and dignity. We know the challenges are complex, but we also know that presence matters, and Peace continues to show up.

As we move into the new year, our prayer is that Peace remains a place where hope grows, love multiplies, and community thrives. Thank you to every volunteer, donor, and partner who has helped make this ministry possible.
