Pastor John's Reflection



Ground-breaking Blessing for the new 2 bedroom DADU for housing ministry

"The angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you **good news** of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." — Luke 2:10-11

Good news! Don't we long for good news today? Coming up on three years of a pandemic, in a world of war and conflict, in a nation of political division

and racial injustice and economic uncertainty, in a city in which a housing crisis has people living in tents in our neighborhood in cold and rainy weather, in a time of distrust of people who are different from us, when family relationships are often strained and mental illness is taking a toll? We need good news!

We've learned by now, the good news we need is not going to come from the results of a political election or an economic forecast. The world-altering, life-changing good news we need isn't going to be the announcement of a new job or better housing or educational degree, though those are very important on our journeys toward greater sustainability in our lives. No, the good news we need comes from God and it comes in a very unlikely way. We call it the "gospel," and the First Nations Version, an indigenous translation of the New Testament, calls it "the good story." It's not a story of earthly power, control, violence, and wealth, which is often the core of the stories we hear in our news. It's a story of peace, forgiveness, justice, hope. It's the greatest story of love ever told.

The media is full of stories. We're inundated by stories all the time coming at us from all directions. What stories are you listening to these days? Which stories shape your values, your purpose, your direction? The angel says to the shepherds that day, "Do not fear! I bring you **the good story** that will be told to all nations."

We're entering the seasons of Advent and Christmas, and at Peace Lutheran Church we will tell again the good story. It's the story of God's love come to us in person in Jesus, the baby born to a poor family in Bethlehem 2000 years ago. It's the story of God meeting us in our brokenness, grief, and suffering to know us, love us, and save us. It's the story of God's life-giving power to release and free us from the powers that hold us—sin, death, evil, injustice. It's the story of God showing us the way to live—a way of nonviolence, mutual respect, compassion, and justice, with a deep heart for the most vulnerable among us. That's the story I want my kids to know. That's the story I want us all to know. That's the story that shapes our church as we live into a community that is "Spirit-filled, compassionate, healthy, reconciled, and just."

Let's go share this **good story** with our lives! Thanks be to God! Blessed Christmas!

Worship & Faith Resources During COVID-19


