Pastor's Reflection

People of Peace,

"But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us." - Ephesians 2:13-14

This is the same scripture passage I used in my Pastor's Reflection for the 2022 summer newsletter. We need to hear this message over and over. Jesus is our peace. He breaks down the walls that divide us. He is our bridge to God and to one another. And racism is a huge



dividing wall. As followers of Jesus, we're called to join Jesus in breaking down that dividing wall, building bridges, helping bring about peace. We say it like this in our Foundational Commitment to Antiracism: "This church names racism (individual and systemic) as sin. We affirm that the diversity of cultures is a God-given gift, and we seek to extend God's love to all our neighbors. We believe Jesus calls us to understand, address, and dismantle racism in individuals, communities, systems, and structures, joining God in bringing about justice for the oppressed and transformation of all society."

Our Future Directions at Peace help us live into this commitment, and we're on the journey. This year two ongoing anti-racist efforts have involved people of Peace church, both called "Confronting Racism"—a Zoom series on racial justice organized by the ecumenical Conversations Around Race of which Peace is a long-time partner, and a monthly gathering of representatives of several congregations in our Lutheran synod for conversation around the book, *How to Fight Racism* by Jemar Tisby, in the direction of actions for racial justice.

In the Conversations Around Race justice series from February through May, we listened to stories of historic injustice (Native American genocide/colonialism, the WW2 Japanese American internment, and Tacoma's own story of institutional racism), and then heard stories of how local Tacoma congregations (Peace and New Salem Baptist) are confronting racism in their congregations and communities.

In the synod journey confronting racism, our Peace team met monthly on our own to examine characteristics of white supremacy culture and antidotes, develop a list of areas of exploration critical to Peace's future in anti-racism, and do initial planning toward an anti-racism resource center for Peace (both a physical on-site library and an online resource list). We are gathering a team to work on the resource center.

At the same time, the Future Directions Action Plan Team at Peace has created an action plan to help us organize ourselves to move forward effectively as we live into our Future Directions we've discerned from God. We are now taking steps to pull together two committees to steer our work, an Anti-Racism Work Group and a Ministry of Place/Activation Work Group. The process is slow but deliberate, and we are making progress on our journey. More information to come soon.

Let me conclude by sharing the prayer we put together as a Confronting Racism synod team, led by Rev. Lynn Longfield: We pray...

- + That we will become heart listeners.
- + That we will recognize the knots of racism are beginning to untangle, creating a hunger that desires to be satisfied.
- + That joy will become more and more a part of our efforts together and that that joy become contagious.
- + That persistence, perseverance, and awareness of what could be helpful for the whole congregation will continue and grow in strength.
- + That our gratitude for each other will continue and that we look beyond our particular moment into the future God would have for each of us and for Peace as a whole. Amen!


