


Q1 With the anticipated commercialization of the COVID vaccines this fall, KHF would like to know if your practice is planning to offer the COVID vaccine to your patients.





11	We will be primarily using Pfizer vaccines at all locations, offering them as the main option for vaccination. However, we must be cautious about the short shelf-life of these vaccines. To avoid wastage and unnecessary costs, we will order the minimum quantity required based on the demand we anticipate. We understand that predicting exact usage is challenging due to various factors, but we will strive to minimize any unused doses. A robust refund policy needs to be established to address situations where we may not use all the vaccines we ordered. We should avoid a scenario similar to FLU vaccines, where partial refunds were not possible, resulting in additional costs. It is essential that the refund policy is well-thought-out to protect us from potential losses. In case the vaccination program's initial year does not yield the desired outcomes, we will consult with our medical professionals to assess the effectiveness and decide on the future availability of these vaccines. One of the challenges we anticipate is determining reimbursement procedures. We need to ensure that the process is transparent and fair for both our organization and patients. If patients have to pay for the vaccine out-of-pocket, it may have an impact on our Accounts Receivable (AR). We should prioritize clear communication with patients regarding reimbursement options and financial assistance programs, if available. While these concerns are significant, we acknowledge that there might be other issues to address. Q4 Are you currently stocking and administering COVID vaccine supplied by the state?


