#### Reflection Questions

- What was your first experience of racism? How did you feel?
- What struck you most about Kendi's definitions of racist and anti-racist? Did one category stand out more than others? Explain. (think chapter titles)
- Many argue this book reframes and revitalizes the national conversation on racism. Do you agree? Explain.
- In what ways does your theology inform your understanding of antiracism work?
- Explain your understanding of dueling consciousness. In what ways do you see it manifest in you? How do you work to overcome it?
- Does your understanding of *imago dei* influence the ways that you think about race and culture? How so?
- How do you understand your role in shifting the cultural narrative around racism? What about that of the Church?
- Kendi writes how "there is nothing in our world today, in our history, giving (him) hope that one day antiracists will win the fight." He goes on to explain his hope. What is yours? (238)
