"For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." (Luke 14:11)

Jesus' usage of this verse from Proverbs 25:6-7 reminds us that though virtually every culture urges a sense of humility, those desirous of attaining status in life at best only pay lip service to the advice. I suspect most everyone has had to wrestle with the temptation of status seeking at some time. Likewise, I suspect we have each been chagrined by moments of our own such personal striving for such status.

It is beguiling to begin thinking that somehow, we are more important than others. What others think of us, our reputation within whatever community to which we are most closely affiliated, too often is more motivating of our actions than are our proclaimed values. Jesus utilizes the perceived seats of honor at the banquet to drive home this point. In this scenario our Lord portrays, seating appears to have been the initial choice of the guests and then the host rearranges in a way they deemed proper. though helpful, it does not eliminate the grumbling or subsequent pay back by those who thought they had been somehow disrespected by the seats assigned to them.

Striving to achieve and/or maintain cultural status is an exhausting and never-ending process. There will always be newer and trendier personalities coming along to challenge our perceived sense of our own importance. Our Lord's admonition is, I believe, to strive always to be of service to others and ready to

General Synod 2023

"Making All Things New" will be the theme of the 34th biennial General Synod of the United Church of Christ, scheduled for June 30–July 4, 2023, in Indianapolis.

The General Synod of the United Church of Christ will get back to business a year from now. And it will do so in person.

After an all-virtual experience in 2021, the UCC's biennial national meeting will require all voting delegates to be in Indianapolis in 2023. That's according to the Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson, the associate general minister who serves as Synod administrator.

Delegates and visitors will meet June 30 through July 4 at the Indianapolis Convention Center.
