Members and friends of Penn Central Conference,

"...but instead, let there be thanksgiving." (Ephesians 5:4b)

This morning I heard the story of a man who left a blank journal at his favorite coffee shop and encouraged customers to write a line or two about those things for which they were thankful. This simple gesture expanded into a nationwide project that provides journals to all sorts of places – including schools – to encourage reflection on gratitude.

Gratitude is powerful. We know this from Jesus, who often expressed thanksgiving. Luke relates the story of the 10 lepers (v.11-19) who were cleansed and, of the ten, only one turned back to thank Jesus. Jesus seems incredulous when he asks, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they?" He is intuitively aware that – for some reason – we scrimp on thanksgiving.

This is a strange reality. Humans seem better able to count their losses than their gratitude. I have seen it in my own life and in the lives of churches, how easy it is for us to lament. There is lament for what we have lost and for what we may be losing. There is also lament for things over which we do not have control. Lament is necessary - make no mistake. Our grief is real, and we grieve over those things which were precious to us and are no more. A strange truth emerges as well if we are open to it: Gratitude lessens grief.

All of life involves loss. Yet gratitude can lift us – can change the way our brains work – to bring new perspectives, peace, and emotional free-

dom. I was reminded of this last Satur- Continues on back

"Making All Things New"

General Synod 2023

"Making All Things New" will be the theme of the 34th biennial General Synod of the United Church of Christ, scheduled for June 30–July 4, 2023, in Indianapolis.

The General Synod of the United Church of Christ will get back to business a year from now. And it will do so in person.

After an all-virtual experience in 2021, the UCC's biennial national meeting will require all voting delegates to be in Indianapolis in 2023. That's according to the Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson, the associate general minister who serves as Synod administrator.

Delegates and visitors will meet June 30 through July 4 at the Indianapolis Convention Center.
