

General Synod #33 of the UCC-Resolution 7-RIGHTS OF NATURE - “Who will speak for the trees?”

Although not assigned to a specific committee, I followed the Rights of Nature Resolution, subtitled, “Who Will Speak for the Trees?” As a member of the Green Team/Environmental/Creation Justice Group for the past decade, representing the Central Association and serving as a proponent for the PCC presented Alternatives for Plastic Foam at Synod 32, I felt “called”, delegate wise. Our PCC had endorsed this resolution at our Annual Meeting in June. It was authored by the New Hampshire Conference.

Two familiar voices to me were Rev. Dr. Leah Shade and Rev. Jim Antel, both of whom have presented in our conference. The workshop lecture titled “Voices of Courage in a Time of Climate Crisis” included: “Could we make God a Member of our Church? Make a Creation Tithe? Establish an Eco Ethical Ark? Become a Blessing to ALL Living Things? Sing to the Trees?”
