A Message from PCC

Greetings members and friends of Penn Central Conference,

"By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return." (Genesis 3:19)

Years ago, I was the pastor of a small church in New Jersey. A young couple from Liberia who came to the United States to work for Bell Labs joined our church. Soon after they became members the congregation was overjoyed to learn that the young woman was pregnant. Even more so when we learned she was to have fraternal twins. Months later when her delivery day came, I received a call from the hospital. The infant girl had survived, but not the boy. The news was crushing for everyone. Some days later the husband called to let me know their infant son had been cremated and they wished to put his ashes in the church's new memorial garden. I said yes, knowing his ashes would be the first to grace the garden. The couple and I gathered at the small garden while the baby girl slept in a carrier nearby. They took out a very small plastic bag containing the ashes of their son. The parents poured the ashes into the ground and shook out the tiny bag whereupon ashes clung to the mother's hands. We filled in the hole and then we joined hands to pray. As the young mother put her hand in mine, I immediately felt the grit of the ashes and the dirt from the tiny grave. Then I felt the warmth of her hand.

In that instant I knew we were joined in a profound moment of realization. As we were surrounded by gravestones, I had a sudden awareness that we are truly both dust and life. Our existence includes the grave at our feet and the warm life between our *Continues on back*

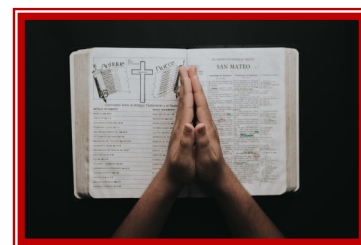

I expect to see again how the burden and reality of death is lessened when we hold it together and acknowledge it before the Lord of Life. On Ash Wednesday we are reminded that we came from the dust of the earth, and we shall return to it. But we are also to remember that the hands of God hold both the grit and the warmth of all life, including our own.

“Making All Things New” will be the theme of the 34th biennial General Synod of the United Church of Christ, scheduled for June 30–July 4, 2023, in Indianapolis.

The General Synod of the United Church of Christ will get back to business a year from now. And it will do so in person.

After an all-virtual experience in 2021, the UCC's biennial national meeting will require all voting delegates to be in Indianapolis in 2023. That's according to the Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson, the associate general minister who serves as Synod administrator.. Delegates and visitors will meet June 30 through July 4 at the Indianapolis Convention Center.
