

MEET UNDOCUMENTED YOUTH A PANEL DISCUSSION WITH DACA RECIPIENTS

Since 2012, the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program gave temporary deportation reprieves, and work authorization, to about 800,000 people who were brought to the U.S. before the age of 16 and have lived here since 2007. This group of young people, often described as “Dreamers,” have been able to enroll in college, legally secure employment, and fully realize their social and economic contributions—benefitting all in the U.S.

In early September 2017, President Trump’s administration announced the termination of the DACA **which would have resulted in people losing their DACA in large numbers starting on March 6, 2018**. Two courts subsequently halted, the government’s termination of DACA and required U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to continue accepting DACA renewals from current DACA recipients. Learn more about how these decisions have impacted people in our community and possible steps Congress could take to reach a legislative solution.

The Quentin United Church of Christ invites the community to a panel discussion about the initial implementation, recent rescinding of the DACA program and its status. Undocumented activists and legal counsel from a local immigration and refugee program will discuss real-life implications of the DACA program.
