

### Suggested In-Person Worship Activities by Phase

<b>Action</b>	<b>Red Phase: Stay at Home Order</b>	<b>Yellow Phase: Restricted Access to some activities</b>	<b>Green Phase: Open Access to all activities</b>
In-person worship	No	Yes (Max 25, practice social distancing, wear masks, use every other pew)	Yes (continue social distancing – as recommended by CDC); 50% occupancy for over 25 members; limit of 250
Singing	No	Recommended no congregation or choir only	Recommended no congregation or choir until further notice
Peace of Christ (with touch)	No	No	Yes (by personal choice)
Time with Children	No	Yes if children remain in pews with family unit	Yes (may adapt)
Offering (passing plates)	No	No (see options below)	Yes
Communion by intinction or passing plate/cup	No	No (see option below)	Yes, but with adaptations suggested below (e.g. no intinction)
Hymnal/Pew Bible	No	No (all music projected or put in bulletin)	Yes
Nursery	No	No	Consider CDC daycare recommendations
Bulletins	No	Yes, congregants take away with them	Yes
Fellowship before/after	No	No	Yes (with social distancing); use extreme caution with food events
Sunday School/Confirmation/Youth Group	No	No (unless under 25 gathered, with masks and maintain social distance)	Yes

## Church Events/Activities

Action	Red Phase	Yellow Phase	Green Phase
In-person worship	No	Yes (Max 25, masks, social distancing)	Yes (with limits, see above)
Physical Distance	Yes (all)	Yes (6 feet, with mask)	Yes
Personal Touch Rituals	No	No	Yes (some may be limited)
Food Events	No	No	Yes (with extreme caution)
In-Person Meetings	No	Yes (max 25, social distancing, masks)	Yes (social distancing)
Office Opened to Public	No	No	Yes
Mission/Outreach Events	No	Very Limited (depends on activity, with masks, social distancing)	Yes (social distancing)
Church Rentals	No	Yes (max 25, depends on capacity to clean)	Yes (depends on capacity)

### Meeting In-Person in the Yellow Phase:

- Encourage current worship practices of Red Phase through month of May
- Suggest requirements for church worship leaders (ushers, readers, etc.):
  - o Younger than 60
  - o No auto-immune or underlying health issues
  - o Willing to wear mask, gloves, and practice social distancing
- Offerings can be left in basket/plate by to sanctuary door. One usher (wearing gloves) responsible for collecting and counting money. Offering can also be submitted on-line (depending on availability), or mailed to church.
- Communion elements can be brought from home for each individual/family to use in the pew.
