I have just returned from a week at Lancaster Theological Seminary where I was in class for more than 10 hours each day. This intensive week of face-to-face class is complemented by an additional 9 weeks of on-line work and study as I work toward a Doctorate in Ministry. Last Saturday I was working on my sermon for Sunday morning and making a gallon of tea. I had been praying over this Luke passage for a week as I sat in class seeking a word from the Spirit. I had also been reading the new theological statements from the UCC Historical Council that I would be presenting at an association meeting that Sunday afternoon. I wanted something more than a 'be humble' sermon for this text and I was desperate for a way to talk about these broad, counter-cultural claims that didn't name the big stuff like the Trinity or Atonement or the Sacraments.

I took a break to go make the tea as the aroma filled the house. While pouring the hot tea over the measured Splenda in the jug, the disruption of the liquid was all that was needed to turn the Splenda flakes into liquid that joined seamlessly with the tea.

I guess I was so stuck on my sermon and reaching for anything the Spirit might be sending my way, the way the tea absorbed the Splenda and became one as I poured made me almost weepy as I



thought about how God's mercy, grace and love makes me at one with God. My composition has to change, just as that of the sweetener, in order to be at one with God. Something disruptive has to occur.

I think of atonement as the way in which one understands being brought into a state of being at-one with God. This happens because of God's grace. The sugar is changed to sweet tea simply by the disruptive addition of the liquid. In Jesus' parable, the tax collector is justified by the admission of his need.

Start a discussion in your church about how you understand this movement of becoming at ONE with God.
