**James 1:13-25:** Whenever you feel tempted to do something bad, you should not say, "God is tempting me." Evil cannot tempt God, and God Himself does not tempt anyone. **14** You are tempted by the evil things you want. Your own desire leads you away and traps you. **15** Your desire grows inside you until it results in sin. Then the sin grows bigger and bigger and finally ends in death. **16** My dear brothers and sisters, don't be fooled about this. **17** Everything good comes from God. Every perfect gift is from Him. These good gifts come down from the Father who made all the lights in the sky. But God never changes like the shadows from those lights. He is always the same. **18** God decided to give us life through the true message He sent to us. He wanted us to be the most important of all that He created. **19** My dear brothers and sisters, always be more willing to listen than to speak. Keep control of your anger. **20** Anger does not help you live the way God wants. **21** So get rid of everything evil in your lives—every kind of wrong you do. Be humble and accept God's teaching that is planted in your hearts. This teaching can save you. **22** Do what God's teaching says; don't just listen and do nothing. When you only sit and listen, you are fooling yourselves. **23** Hearing God's teaching and doing nothing is like looking at your face in the mirror **24** and doing nothing about what you saw. You go away and immediately forget how bad you looked. **25** But when you look into God's perfect law that sets people free, pay attention to it. If you do what it says, you will have God's blessing. Never just listen to His teaching and forget what you heard. - ERV

**A truly repentant person has come to understand Jesus as Lord over every area of life. That is why they can believe Jesus will change their life. The idea that God will bless an unrepentant believer is contrary to scripture and common sense. Everything is open before Him. And to Him we must explain the way we have lived. 14 We have a great high priest who has gone to live with God in heaven. He is Jesus the Son of God. So let us continue to express our faith in Him. 15 Jesus, our high priest, is able to understand our weaknesses. When Jesus lived on earth, He was tempted in every way. He was tempted in the same ways we are tempted, but He never sinned. 16 With Jesus as our high priest, we can feel free to come before God’s throne where there is grace. There we receive mercy and kindness to help us when we need it. ESV
