Where and When is the AG?

The 2026 Annual Gathering will once again be held at the Florida Hotel in Orlando, Florida. The hotel is adjacent to the Florida Mall, making nearby shopping and restaurants easily accessible. Information about this location can be found here: <https://www.thefloridahotelorlando.com/>

Exhibits are welcome to set up Monday morning, August 3rd, and remain until Thursday at noon, giving attendees ample time to stop by your table or booth! The exhibit space is centrally located in the mezzanine – directly in the middle of our meeting areas and registration.

How much does it cost to exhibit?

The exhibit fee includes one 6' skirted table and two chairs. Electrical usage is limited and available on a first-come first-served basis. Electrical use is an additional \$25 per table.

- Parachurch Ministry/Businesses/University = \$600
A second table may be purchased for an additional \$400
- Missions agency/Missionaries = \$150
A second table may be purchased for an additional \$150
- CCCC Ministries (e.g. Micronesia Ministry, Congregational Institute) – \$35
A second table may be purchased for an additional \$35.

Note: In addition to the exhibit fee, all exhibitors are required to register for the full, 4-day AG (includes Monday evening reception, breakfast buffet Tuesday and Wednesday) and are responsible for lodging accommodation.

Are there additional sponsorship/promotion opportunities?

Sponsor a breakfast -- \$1,000

- Signage at breakfast, listed on sponsorship page in program

Sponsor the Monday evening ice cream dessert -- \$1,000

- Signage at ice cream event, listed on sponsorship page in program

Program advertisement -- \$1200 (non-exhibitors) – \$500 (exhibitors)

Each attendee receives a copy of the program, it is a “workbook” for the AG. Space is limited, on a first-come first-served basis. *Only full-page ads will be available in the program. High resolution, 300dpi .jpg or .tiff must be received by May 1, 2026.*

Application Process

1. Complete the attached application by clicking [HERE](#). Exhibit space is available on a first come, first served basis.
2. Once approved, the Home Office will send you the registration link to register for the AG and pay for your exhibit, as well as where to book hotel accommodation. Failure to register and pay will result in forfeiture of your exhibit space.
3. Once fees are paid and your organization is confirmed, you will be listed on the AG Website [HERE](#) as an exhibitor as well as in the program.

Shipping Exhibit Materials Prior to the AG:

PLEASE notify the Home Office of any materials you intend to ship PRIOR to the AG.

All packages need to arrive *after* July 31st and are subject to receiving/handling fees (to be paid by the exhibitor directly to the hotel) per The Florida Hotel:

- All incoming packages and special deliveries: \$10 per piece
- Pallets up to 500 lbs - \$100 per pallet; over 500 lbs - \$200 per pallet

AG Exhibits Policy Statement

CCCC Statement of Faith

Annual Gathering Exhibits Policy Statement

The Annual Gathering Coordinator, in conjunction with the Home Office, invites potential exhibitors, reviews applications, collects fees and organizes the on-site layout of the venue's exhibits area. Applications by CCCC Committees or Regional Fellowships shall receive automatic approval. Applications by mission organizations, businesses, other ministries or individuals must meet all of the criteria set forth below.

1. Their theological position must fit within the parameters of the CCCC Statement of Faith (see next page).
2. Since our CCCC fellowship is built on love, unity and liberty within theological diversity, the philosophy and practice of all applicants must fit within our emphasis of unity in diversity under the headship of Christ.
3. No materials may be displayed or distributed that are intended to attack doctrinal positions that are acceptable within the parameters of our CCCC fellowship, or to disparage those who hold such positions (see for example, "Statement Regarding Ministerial Standing of Women" and "Statement Regarding the Charismatic Movement" at <https://www.ccccusa.com/resources/publications/>).

The Exhibits Coordinator shall examine the applications of all potential exhibitors and review samples of literature the applicants intend to make available. Questions concerning the suitability of an application/materials shall be referred to the Coordinators of the Annual Gathering Planning Committee for review against the above requirements (1-3). They shall render to the Exhibits Coordinator their endorsement or denial of questionable applications.

Article III – Statement of Faith

Conservative Congregational Christian Conference - Revised 2015
