

MCC/Florida Tech Emerging Scholars Informational Meeting

The MCC and Florida Tech Emerging Scholars Program allows qualified juniors and seniors to begin their college career while enrolled in high school. This collaboration enables MCC students to enroll at Florida Tech and earn up to 24 credit hours at no additional tuition cost. Qualified MCC students attend classes during the school day on the Florida Tech campus in collaboration with their traditional high school classes at MCC. Credits taken at Florida Tech may be used to fulfill MCC graduation requirements. Students are allowed to take up to 2 courses a semester.

On Tuesday, February 11, MCC will be hosting an Emerging Scholars Program Meeting during both A and B lunch in the Sullivan Classroom. Mr. Rodd Newcombe, Academic Support Advisor, and Shannon Reilly, Admissions Counselor will be on campus to discuss the program, requirements, application and process. If you are a sophomore or junior and interested in taking classes at Florida Tech for the 2020-2021 school year, I encourage you to attend. This will be a working lunch, so please bring your lunch with you. Juniors who are currently enrolled and will continue to take classes next year, do not need to attend.

Initial entrance requirements include a minimum of a B in related high school coursework, competitive SAT or ACT scores, and a counselor recommendation. A SAT minimum of a 550 in Math AND 550 in Evidence Based Reading and Writing is required. Comparable ACT scores are also acceptable (Composite 26). More information and application instructions will be given at the meeting. Information for parents will be given at the Class of 2021 and Class of 2022 Parent Meeting.
