Community Health Corps Montana aims to engage individuals in meaningful service to Montana through community partnerships to advance sustainable solutions to the state's most pressing health challenges. Housed at the Montana Office of Rural Health and Area Health Education Center, the AmeriCorps program will place service-driven individuals in community organizations to **strengthen mental health and substance use disorder resources, improve chronic disease prevention and management, and address social determinants of health.**

What Is AmeriCorps?

AmeriCorps is a national service program that places dedicated individuals in communities to support locally driven solutions. AmeriCorps members do not replace staff or duplicate employee work; they bring additional capacity to expand impact. Our Montana-based program will place members with host organizations

September 2025 to July 2026.

How Can AmeriCorps Members Support Host Sites?

AmeriCorps members' service strengthens local initiatives, builds sustainable health solutions, and develops the next generation of community leaders.

Examples of member service efforts include:

- ✓ **Enhance Capacity**
Create resource directories, assist in policy development, and streamline data collection efforts to strengthen health initiatives.
- ✓ **Host Community Events**
Organize community engagement events to raise mental health awareness, enhance chronic disease management, and address social determinants of health.
- ✓ **Support Local Collaboration**
Facilitate communications to improve resource navigation and coordination between healthcare providers, food banks, housing organizations, and transportation services.
