



**Dr. Chiquita Berg**

Dr. Chiquita Berg is a visionary physician leader committed to transforming healthcare and advancing the well-being of vulnerable populations. As Vice President of Community Health and Well-Being at Trinity Health Michigan, she leads innovative efforts to address social determinants of health, reduce health disparities, and ensure equitable access to care across the state. Dr. Berg earned her medical degree from Wayne State University School of Medicine in Detroit, where, in 1997, she made history as the first African American and only the second woman to be elected class president since the school's founding in 1868. She completed her OB/GYN residency at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor before dedicating over a decade to serving underserved communities at a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) in Jackson, Michigan. These experiences strengthened her commitment to health equity and helped shape her path as a leader.

In 2018, Dr. Berg returned to Trinity Health to help expand obstetrics and gynecological services in Westland, MI, an area with significant healthcare needs. Driven by her desire to create lasting change, she pursued an Executive MBA from the University of Michigan Ross School of Business, where she was recognized as one of Poets & Quants' Best & Brightest Executive MBAs in 2021.

Upon completing her MBA, Dr. Berg was selected as the inaugural physician fellow in a pilot corporate leadership development program aimed at fostering the next generation of physician-leaders. This one-year, hands-on experience allowed her to successfully transition into her current leadership role as Vice President of Community Health and Well-Being at Trinity Health Michigan. In this capacity, she oversees more than \$230 million in community benefit and community impact spending, driving critical programming that integrates social and clinical care, optimizes data collection, and ensures sustainable funding to foster health equity and improve well-being across the communities Trinity Health serves.

While her leadership role has evolved toward administration, Dr. Berg remains actively engaged in direct patient care as a practicing gynecologist. She continues to perform gynecological surgeries and stays connected with the realities of frontline healthcare, making sure her leadership stays rooted in real experience. Dr. Berg is a Fellow of the American College of Obstetrics and

Gynecology and serves on the Advisory Committee for Birth Detroit, a non-profit organization dedicated to reducing healthcare disparities in maternal care.
