


I look forward to gathering together and sharing more of these stories with everyone at Basil's Big Bash on June 10th!

A Chance Meeting Changed Giselle's Life Forever

THE PERFECT HOME IS WORTH THE WAIT

ASAP doesn't put a restriction of time on cats in our care. Many cats come in and out of our doors quickly, and cats generally spend very little time at the shelter before going to foster homes during the pandemic. Some stay with us for weeks or months. In some cases, like Giselle's, that can even mean years.

Giselle joined ASAP in 2019, at the age of 14. She spent much of her time with ASAP in various foster homes needing to be returned to the shelter for a variety of reasons. She was most recently brought back when her foster was unable to care for her after they suffered a nasty fall. As fate would have it, that return to the shelter is what connected Giselle to her forever home. We're happy to share this happy ending excerpt from Jeffyne Telson of RESQCATS, Giselle's new home!

"I happened to meet Giselle in the lobby at ASAP when I was there doing an errand. Since I had a resident enclosure open after so many losses, I expressed my desire to help with one that would most likely never find a home. My friend at ASAP and I discussed several options, but most were younger than I wanted to commit to. All the while Giselle curled around my legs and found her way up to my shoulder. I left ASAP with the notion that perhaps the right match would be found and reiterated that my heart was open to helping.

But I didn't make it home before I messaged and said, "I meant what I said about wanting to help, but what I would really like is that cat in the lobby named Giselle!" I was told that the shelter thought they might lose her a couple of times, sometimes she just quit eating and they suspected she had cancer...none of that mattered to me. My offer still stood.

Two days later, just before Thanksgiving when we all should stop and feel grateful for what we have, but also give back to the world in some small way, Giselle came to RESQCATS.

This little girl has settled into her own space and will eventually have the option of going into a private outside enclosure too... it just needs to be a bit warmer. I'm not sure she will use her outside space as she seems so content with her heated basket and upper shelf with a view into the avocado grove.

I was excited to finally have a resident cat without attitude, but Giselle does have a little spice sometimes... Mostly she is one of the most loving cats I have ever had. We have little "love" sessions every morning and every afternoon where she sits in her basket or on my lap for massages. In return, I get licked and groomed by her. It seems, however, that her favorite spot is perched on my shoulder...so sometimes we dance to soft music in the cattery with her there.

May she be a reminder to all of us that all the cats need homes... even the elderly. Giselle brings out the most tender side of my soul. **After all, older cats need homes, too...**and I will love her for however long she has here on Earth."

2021 In Review


Dear ASAP Friends,

Although it's worth noting that ASAP's role in providing a safety net for ALL cats in our community, our success is not measured solely by the numbers in this report.

Since ASAP began in 1989, we have been able to rescue thousands and thousands of cats, giving them a chance at a beautiful life in a loving home. A key factor that we are tremendously proud of, and which is not accurately reflected in the numbers, is that ASAP's shelter is open to ALL cats and kittens needing help in our community. We do not pick and choose them based on age, physical condition, or behavior. We serve the cats that many other shelters turn away, making us the undisputed leader in feline care in our community. Additionally, the numbers don't reflect the impact of our Retention and Community Cats Programs that are designed to keep cats in their homes and out of the shelter.

We can all hope the hardships that were brought about by the pandemic are largely behind us. It's been an adventure, to say the least. What I'll never forget is how hard everyone worked to sustain ASAP. It took creativity, long hours, and a lot of fortitude on the part of the entire ASAP family. The care we provide these precious felines now will have an impact in their future and ours. Thank you for joining us in making the world better for these cats and kittens, because, without a doubt, our world and our lives are infinitely better with them in it.





Behind the Numbers

The numbers above, while important in tracking our successes, miss a large part of the ASAP picture. One of our biggest accomplishments in 2021 was the expansion of our Community Cats program, in line with national sheltering practices. Kind-hearted and well-meaning individuals see a cat outside and may immediately think it should be brought to a shelter. But often, they are simply outdoor cats, or cats that have a safe and warm home nearby and a family that loves and cares for them.

Many shelters, including ASAP, are updating their guidance information about strays and how to determine if a cat in the community should be considered lost and in need of help. If the cat appears healthy and cared for, it can stay in its community. We should note, it is difficult for us to track the numbers around how many cats we have prevented from being taken from their homes by well meaning people bringing them to ASAP, but please remember: ASAP's doors are always open to all cats and kittens in need of our care.


