UNIFORM DRESS CODE POLICY

AMS schools have the responsibility to promote the basic rules of sanitation, safety, neatness, and modesty while on campus. Research has demonstrated that schools with dress codes set a tone for serious study, facilitate school pride, and enhance overall school safety. The uniform policy may be subject to change upon notification of parents throughout the school year. All modifications and changes are up to the discretion of the principal and administrative staff as needs arise.

Pants/Shorts/Skirts/Skortts

Navy Blue or Khaki colored uniform pants or shorts, no more than 4 pockets at the waist. Hems or cuffs at the bottom and fit to waist within 2 inches (no baggy pants). Belts (optional): black or brown leather with brass buckles only. No sweatpants or stretchy materials including leggings. All shorts, skorts, and skirts must be at most 2 inches above the knee. No jeans or jean shorts of ANY kind. All apparel must be free of logos and graphics except for the school logo.

Shirts

Navy blue or maroon, 2-3 button polo shirt with collar and no logos (except for the school logo). Shirt must cover the top edge of the pants when arms are raised or remain tucked and must fit the appropriate size of the individual. Undershirts MUST be in solid blue or white. All apparel must be free of large or offensive graphics.

Shoes

Tennis shoes/dress shoes are encouraged and recommended. No shoes with wheels. No CROCs, flip-flops or slippers of any kind.

Additional Dress Code Information

All apparel with the school logo may be worn, except t-shirts. In addition to the Uniform Dress Code above, several other restrictions are routinely enforced. Bandannas, either worn or carried, are prohibited. No hats, hoods, or visors are permitted in the buildings. Unnatural hair color or body art, which is distracting, is not permitted. Piercing of the nose, eyebrows, lips, tongue, etc. are prohibited. Piercings are allowed in ears only.

Students who violate the Dress Code policy are subject to disciplinary action.

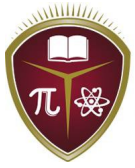

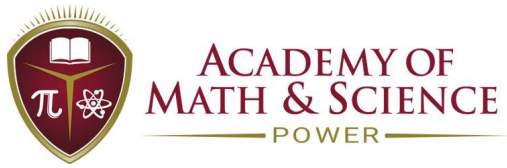

- Extended care fees are collected quarterly and must be paid in full before attendance.
- Quarters containing school holidays or intersessions are not discounted.
- AMS does not offer a reduced rate for prepayment of fees.
- Students may only be picked up by those individuals identified as pick-up contacts in PowerSchool.
- Pick-up contacts will be required to show ID to the AMS Extended Care staff each time they pick up a student.
- All students must be picked up by 6:00 PM
 - Students not picked up by 6:00 PM will be charged a late pick-up fee of \$1/minute.
 - At 6:00 PM calls will be placed to all available contacts for any student not picked up and repeated every 15 minutes.
 - If attempts at contact are unsuccessful after the third call attempt, local law enforcement will be contacted for assistance at 6:30 PM.
 - Three late pickups in a year will result in the removal of the student from the program.
- Students must conduct themselves in a safe and respectful manner. Should a student fail to do so, the following steps will be followed:
 - First Incident: Parent notification at pick up
 - Second Incident: Parent notification and immediate pick up
 - Third Incident: Short term suspension from the program (1-5 days)
 - Fourth/final Incident: Long Term Suspension from the program (5-90 days)
- Fees may be prorated monthly in the case of an enrollment mid-quarter.
 - All students who enroll during the first full month of the quarter will pay 100% of the fee.
 - If a student enters the program during the second month of a quarter, 66% of the fee will be assessed.
 - If a student enters the program during the third month of a quarter, 33% of the fee will be assessed.
- In the event of a student withdrawal, program fees may be refunded on a monthly prorated basis. A parent seeking a refund must complete the Fee Refund Request Form.
 - If a student withdraws in the first month of the quarter, 66% of the fee will be refunded.
 - If a student withdraws in the second month of the quarter, 33% of the fee will be refunded.
 - If a student withdraws during the last month of the quarter, no fees will be refunded.
- Students asked to cease participation in the AMS Extended Care program due to behavior issues or repeated late pickups are not eligible to receive a refund of fees paid.

**Any aggressive, violent, or extreme behaviors may result in immediate pick up and suspension from the program regardless of incident number.*



Extracurricular Activities

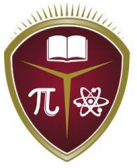
All AMS students (K-8) can participate in activities outside of the regular school day that enhance their school experience and deepen their social and intellectual growth. Extracurriculars are tailored to student and parent interests and vary from campus to campus.

Clubs are offered each quarter and meet 6 – 8 times, depending on the length of the quarter. Clubs either meet once or twice per week, with most clubs meeting weekly on the same day each week. Students in all grades can participate in clubs, but some clubs may only be offered to specific grade bands for age-appropriate groups.

There are four (4) seasons for sports (these do not line up exactly with the school quarters), each season offering different sport options to 5th – 8th grade students. Students wanting to participate in sports must receive a sports physical before participating in any activity for that sport (tryouts, practice, or games). Teams will practice at minimum twice per week and during the season they will have 1-2 games per week, in addition to practices.

Extracurricular Policies and Procedures

- Extracurricular options will be communicated to families before the start of each quarter/season.
- Club registration is on a first come, first served basis.
- Extracurricular fees are collected quarterly, or before the start of the sports season, and must be paid in full before participation.
- Program availability is based on student interest.
- AMS reserves the right to cancel an activity due to low interest or registration.
- Sports registration is based on tryouts. Not all students are guaranteed to make a sports team, however all are invited to participate in tryouts.
- Students wanting to participate in sports must receive a sports physical before participating in any sport (tryouts, practice, or games).
- Parents/Guardians must attend a parent meeting before the sports season to review expectations of the students and the parents during the season.
- Club fees are collected before each quarter and must be paid in full before participation. If fees are not paid by the end of the first week of the club, the student may be removed from the club roster.
- Sport fees are applied to student accounts after try outs when they have been officially named to the team. Sport fees must be paid before the season starts, or the student cannot participate in games until fees are paid.
- Fees may be prorated monthly in the case of an enrollment mid-quarter.
 - All students who enroll during the first full month of the quarter will pay 100% of the fee.
 - If a student enters the program during the second month of a quarter, 66% of the fee will be assessed.
 - If a student enters the program during the third month of a quarter, 33% of the fee will be assessed.
- In the event of a student withdrawal, program fees may be refunded on a monthly prorated basis. A parent seeking a refund must complete the Fee Refund Request Form.
