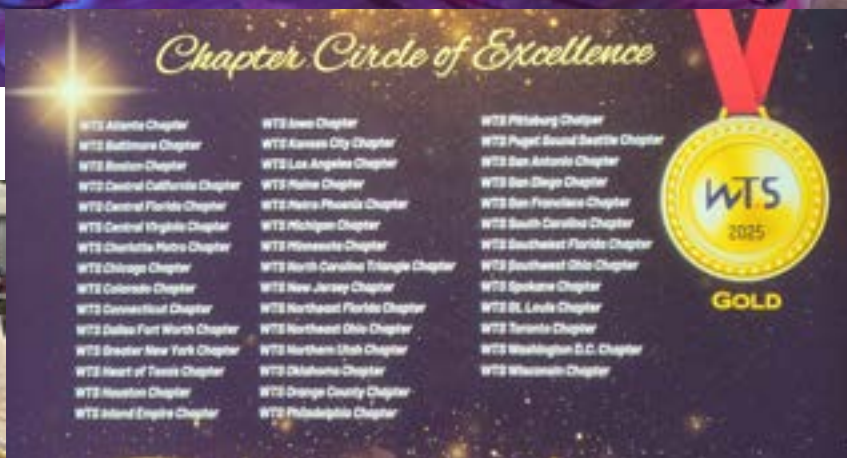

AASHTO Spring Meeting

The 2025 American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) Spring Meeting provided transportation leaders the opportunity to collaborate on some of the biggest issues facing the industry today and tomorrow. Experts from all over the country gathered for sessions that highlighted topics on the top of mind for state departments of transportation and partner agencies. CTDOT Commissioner Garrett Eucalitto serves as AASHTO President this term and organized the “Centering Safety” exhibit, titled *ConneCTing Today for a Safer Tomorrow: Incorporating Innovation, Safety, and Empathy into Transportation* where WTS Connecticut played a leading role in organizing the space.

The immersive exhibit was created in collaboration with CTDOT, MassDOT, UConn T2 Center, Ocean State Signal, and MXT Reality featuring the Empathy at the Intersection experience. The initiative puts transportation professionals into customers’ shoes to experience the street through the perspective of vulnerable users and operators. By immersing participants in the real-world experiences of drivers and vulnerable road users, including people with disabilities, older adults, and pedestrians as well as employees driving fleet vehicles such as plow trucks and buses, the exhibit fosters deeper empathy and awareness among transportation professionals.
