And he (Jesus) added, “God blesses those who do not fall away because of me.”

Matthew 11:6 (NLT)

According to the words following and preceding Matthew 11:6, there will come a day when you and I get discouraged. There will be days when we want to give up. There will be days when we want to curse God. There will be days when we feel that there is no hope. Perhaps you, like me, feel the events in our world currently are taking an adversarial toll on our faith and desires. Perhaps we are already feeling what Jesus is speaking about to the disciples and people gathered around him. He wrote a book called “The Governance of God” in which he tried to explain the political and moral causes of the collapse of the Roman state in the west; he argued that the misfortunes of the time were divinely inflicted punishments which the people of the Empire had brought upon themselves by their corruption.

When we fulfill some or none of God's commands, why do we complain about God, who has more reason to complain about all of us? What is our reason for saying in sorrow that God does not regard us, when we ourselves do not heed Him? What is our reason for muttering that God does not look down towards earth, when we ourselves do not look up towards Heaven?

Considering this writing, I believe it is important for all of us to believe that when things are looking down, look up! Ask God for help! And praise God for his love! And then stand by. Stand by with arms open. Stand by with arms open ready to receive God's blessing! Hear me say that again – Stand by with arms open ready to receive God's blessings.
