***Visually and intellectually take a Reading Walk
through the New Testament in 90 days (NT90)***

Many of you will be reading NT90 in Sunday School or a Weekly Bible Study time. For those who are not already engaged in a group on Sunday morning, this is an invitation to join Pastor Faiana, Don Davidson, and me Sundays February 26 – May 28 in the Tom Vastine building—**room C-19**.

We will gather each Sunday at 9:45 for discussions about the reading you completed during the week. Together, we'll spend time each Sunday discussing personal observations, sharing joys from the reading, and asking questions that lead to open contribution among friends.

Here is the assignment for our class time together Sunday February 26. Please read as much of days 1-3 prior to Sunday. We will discuss only Chapters 1-10 this week and will pick up on March 5 discussing Matthew 11 – Mark 16. This will set the standard for sharing each other's perception and understanding of the verses each week.

Consider these questions in preparation of our time together:

Chapters 1-4

- How would you describe God's protection of Jesus over His childhood years?
- What was the message from John the Baptizer to the religious community?
- How would you describe Jesus' response to His temptation in the wilderness?
- What was the reaction of the first people that Jesus called to be His followers?

Chapters 5-7

- What did you learn about Jesus' teaching disciples about their influence and relationship with enemies?
- How would you summarize Jesus' teachings about the letter of the law and intent behind the law?
- What did you notice about Jesus' view of giving, praying, and fasting?
- What's your view about Jesus' stand on worrying?

Chapters 8-10

- What was Jesus' expectations who go about correcting other people?
- How do you know the nature of people from Jesus' descriptions of fruit trees?
- What is Jesus' requirement for being a wise builder?
- What do these verses teach about Jesus' response to the Poor and Needy?
