



Scripture Reading

Luke 7:1-17

1 After Jesus finished presenting all his words among the people, he entered Capernaum. **2** A centurion had a servant who was very important to him, but the servant was ill and about to die. **3** When the centurion heard about Jesus, he sent some Jewish elders to Jesus to ask him to come and heal his servant. **4** When they came to Jesus, they earnestly pleaded with Jesus. “He deserves to have you do this for him,” they said. **5** “He loves our people and he built our synagogue for us.” **6** Jesus went with them. He had almost reached the house when the centurion sent friends to say to Jesus, “Lord, don’t be bothered. I don’t deserve to have you come under my roof. **7** In fact, I didn’t even consider myself worthy to come to you. Just say the word and my servant will be healed. **8** I’m also a man appointed under authority, with soldiers under me. I say to one, ‘Go,’ and he goes, and to another, ‘Come,’ and he comes. I say to my servant, ‘Do this,’ and the servant does it.” **9** When Jesus heard these words, he was impressed with the centurion. He turned to the crowd following him and said, “I tell you, even in Israel I haven’t found faith like this.” **10** When the centurion’s friends returned to his house, they found the servant restored to health.

11 A little later Jesus went to a city called Nain. His disciples and a great crowd traveled with him. **12** As he approached the city gate, a dead man was being carried out. He was his mother's only son, and she was a widow. A large crowd from the city was with her. **13** When he saw her, the Lord had compassion for her and said, "Don't cry." **14** He stepped forward and touched the stretcher on which the dead man was being carried. Those carrying him stood still. Jesus said, "Young man, I say to you, get up." **15** The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother. **16** Awestruck, everyone praised God. "A great prophet has appeared among us," they said. "God has come to help his people." **17** This news about Jesus spread throughout Judea and the surrounding region.




