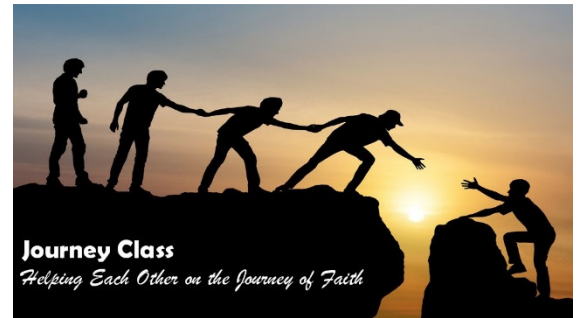


James – Growing Thru Trials

The book of James deals with the practical side of faith. In other words, what does a life lived in faith to Jesus look like?

James is pretty “in your face” – Talk is cheap, he argues, but service is invaluable. It is not that works save the believer, but that works are a mark the believer.



James writes about the benefits that could result from hardship and the importance of living genuine lives of faith.

Read James 1:1-11
