California Emergency Services
Act authorizes local jurisdictions
to create a Disaster Council,

Responsible for developing emergency plans

City of Chula Vista Municipal Code – Chapter 2.14 – Emergency Organization Department

Provides for the protection of persons and property in Chula Vista

#### Emergency Organization

- All public employees are considered Disaster Service Workers
  - CA Government Code Section 3100-3109
- Public, private, and community support and participation are critical to effective preparedness, response, and recovery efforts


























#### Local Hazards

- Wildfire
  - 30+ canyons and open space areas
  - Wildland-Urban Interface
- Earthquake
  - Several faults with potential to impact the city
- Flooding
  - Two reservoirs border the city, multiple inundation areas
- Extreme Weather
  - 2017 Winter Storms
  - 2022 Heat Wave




















# Emergency Operations Center

- Coordination of personnel and resources
- Effective, objective driven decision-making
- Reliable and accurate public information and warning

#### Wildfires

- 10 Fire Stations
  - 2 additional Fire Stations coming online by 2025)
  - Personnel receive wildland firefighting training on an annual basis
- Type III Engine (Brush Rig)
  - Specially equipped for wildland firefighting
- Master Mutual Aid

- Hazardous Fuels Reduction Program
- Weed Abatement Program
- Defensible Space and Wildland Urban Interface Codes


# Extreme Weather

- Advanced Planning Using NWS Weather Forecasts
  - CVFD Weather Stations
- Public Works Stormwater Division
  - Works year-round to clear storm drain channels, culverts, and outfalls
- Sandbag Distribution
- Fire Department Swiftwater Rescue Personnel



#### Measure P

- Critical Infrastructure Repairs
  - Preventative maintenance; making repairs before systems fail
- Replacing Outdated Infrastructure
  - Corrugated metal pipes replaced with modern
  - Allow systems to perform as intended
- Complementary Repairs
  - Road conditions factor into drainage
  - Good roads ideal for first responders








# City of Chula Vista prepared in the event of a tsunami

#### **Cool Zone Transportation**

Northwest Chula Vista residents, age 55+, can utilize the Chula Vista Community Shuttle for free rides to the cool zones at the Civic Center Library or the Norman Park Senior Center

Additionally, people in San Diego County unable to get to a Cool Zone location without transportation assistance, such as older adults, people with disabilities, or people who are homebound, can call 2-1-1 to be connected to a transportation or rideshare service at no cost.
