FINANCIAL NEWS: Financial Report--Operating Funds

Highlights:

- Living River has been able to make all monthly mortgage payments thanks to the diligence of the Presbytery Trustees in working out an agreement for the purchase of the former Trinity Church property. Living River has **retired its line of credit** and **our only debt is the mortgage** which is covered by the payments on the Trinity property.
- 2020 donations to Living River are down \$30,000 from 2019.
- Due to the receipt of a PPP loan, Living River has been able to make payroll for 2020.
- Because of the inability to generate revenue from retreat rentals and camp, Living River's expenses exceed our revenue. End-of-year gifts could reverse this.
- We have cut expenses in personnel, utilities, and services.

FINANCIAL NEWS: Living River establishes an Endowment Fund with proceeds from Alice McSpadden Williams Trust

Living River was the recipient of \$478,789 from the Alice McSpadden Williams Trust. Mrs. Williams was a member of Independent Presbyterian Church and a long-time supporter of the mission of Living River. The Living River Board voted to use these funds to honor past promises and prepare for the future. The first and largest portion of this donation was used to establish an endowment with the Presbyterian Foundation's New Covenant Mutual Funds. The proceeds from this endowment will support operations and a camp scholarship fund. An amount of \$100,000 from these funds will be to complete projects promised during earlier fundraising campaigns. The third use of the funds is to set aside a contingency fund of \$50,000 for unexpected and necessary expenses which have not been budgeted. Living River is indebted to the Williams family and the early development team for Living River.

PROGRAM NEWS: Camp in a Box 2020, Summer Camp 2021, Retreats

- Camp in a Box When it became clear that Summer Camp 2020 was not possible in person, *Camp in a Box 2020* was born. Over 200 boxes were mailed or delivered to 2019 campers and other youth and children. Each box contained a guide for a week's worth of camp activities based on 5 Bible stories, craft kits, and camp swag...t-shirt, sunglasses, sticker. Many thanks to the Presbytery of Sheppards and Lapsley for a grant that made this possible.
- Summer Camp 2021 The Program Committee of the Living River Board is making plans for Summer Camp 2021. Our Curriculum will be **Creation Speaks**. Each day will be focused on a different passage of the creation story paired with New Testament, Psalms, and other Old Testament passages. We are preparing policies and procedures to comply with best practice in a COVID world to keep our campers and staff healthy. - Retreats and Day Use While almost all of our retreats cancelled for 2020, we have hosted a few scout troops for primitive camping, a private school football camp and many family groups seeking to enjoy the outdoors. We also hosted a wedding in November. (Look for pictures soon on our website.)

FACILITIES NEWS: Projects

- IPC Chapel Completed The Independent Presbyterian Outdoor Chapel was completed this fall by IPC volunteers, Frank Sutherland, Curtis Williams and others. It is located off of the Main Road trail on a bluff overlooking the river.
- Increased Security and power to maintenance shed--Donors provided funds to increase security and provide power to the maintenance shed after Living River had a break-in. More security cameras were purchased and a power line was run from the road to the maintenance shed. This will serve to protect our property and camp equipment.
- Vegetable Garden A donor wished to honor long-time Living River Board Member and member of Montevallo Presbyterian Church, Judy Rogers, by designating that the donation be spent on a project that would involve children. We chose to build a raised-bed vegetable garden that will provide gardening opportunities and vegetables for summer campers for years to come. Volunteers from South Highland Presbyterian Church planted the garden this summer.
- New doors for bathrooms and showers in cabins-- It was discovered that the prior doors were too heavy for the frames. Thanks to the leadership of Bill Stribling and the hard work of his ecumenical Habitat friends, new doors were made, painted and hung in all of the cabins. Bill's donation of his time and all the supplies for this project are very much appreciated.
- Williams Take Out/Launch Overlook Paul has worked hard to clear out the picnic area at the Williams Canoe Take Out/Launch. There is now a clear view of the river at this picnic/campsite.
- Camp Truck Living River received a generous donation of a used truck this year just as our prior truck was dying. Our "new" truck has over 250,000 miles and we hope it will last many more years. Being realistic, please remember Living River if you hear of anyone wanting to donate a used, full-size pick-up truck.

ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS: Seeking Partners

- Research
 - This past spring and summer found students from Furman University, The University of the South at Sewanee, and St. Louis University participating in undergraduate research projects. These students were recruited by our Environmental Committee Chair, Janet Ort.
 - This fall brought researchers from The University of Alabama, US Geological Survey and the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to Living River to continue the research on mussels that has been going on since the slab was removed in 2004.

- UA undergraduate students visited Living River for a Saturday field experience in November.
- The Environmental Committee continues to explore opportunities for Secondary Research Weekends and the possibility of Living River being a data gathering/clearing house site.
- Higher Education Consortium
 - Living River continues to seek Higher Education partners who wish to conduct research at Living River and provide a way back for the Cahaba Environmental Center.
