Dr. Brennan Breed is Associate Professor of Old Testament at Columbia Theological Seminary. Dr. Breed is a graduate of the University of Virginia, Princeton Theological Seminary, and Emory University. Dr. Breed's research focuses on the reception history of the Bible, which traces the divergent uses and understandings of biblical texts from their ancient contexts of production to the present day. Besides numerous articles and book chapters, Brennan is author of *Nomadic Text: A Theory of Biblical Reception History* and coauthor of the Old Testament Library commentary on the book of Daniel with Carol Newsom. Currently, he is writing a commentary on Ecclesiastes and a volume on the Ptolemaic period with Davis Hankins.
