The crime of sexual assault is one of the most violence crimes a police department will be called upon to investigate. It is imperative that reports of sexual assault are handled in a manner that will provide sensitivity and meet the needs of the victim, as well as ensure proper police procedures relative to crime scene investigation, evidence collection, and documentation are followed. This training will provide a three prong approach to sexual assault investigations including the do's and don'ts of sex crime investigations, understanding trauma, and interviewing/interrogating the suspecting sex offender.
