Through long generations, You have been faithful and kind to all your children. Great and wonderful are Your works, Lord God Almighty. Your ways are just and true. Therefore we lift our hearts in joyful praise, joining our voices with choirs of angels, and with all the faithful of every time and place, who forever sing to the glory of Your name:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Leader: We praise you, most holy God, for sending your only Son to live among us, sharing our joy and sorrow. Jesus Christ told your story, healed the sick, and is a friend of sinners. Obeying you, Jesus took up His cross and died that we might live. We praise you that He overcame death and is risen to rule the world. He is still the friend of sinners. All: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ that we may be for the world the body

of Christ, redeemed by His blood. Send us out in the power of the Spirit to live for others, as Christ lived for us, announcing His death for the sins of the world, and telling His resurrection to all people and nations. By your Spirit, draw us together into one body and join us to Christ the Lord, that we may remain His glad and faithful people until we feast with Him in glory.
