This Mother's Day, as we give thanks for the love, sacrifice, and strength of mothers, we're also invited to put that love into action. Our Mother's Day special offering supports Baby Basics of Collier County—a lifeline for hardworking families with young children who don't qualify for government cash assistance but still struggle to make ends meet.

For many, even something as essential as diapers can become an overwhelming expense. Without a steady supply, babies can suffer from discomfort and health issues, and parents are forced into difficult choices—like buying food or keeping their child clean and dry.

Through Baby Basics, more than 600 babies each month receive the diapers they need across 14 sites in Collier County. This support eases financial stress and helps families focus on other essentials. In fact, 97% of families say they are better able to meet their basic needs because of this program. Still, the need is greater—an estimated 1,500 babies in our community qualify for assistance.

This ministry is about more than diapers. It offers dignity, encouragement, and a reminder that no family is alone.
