



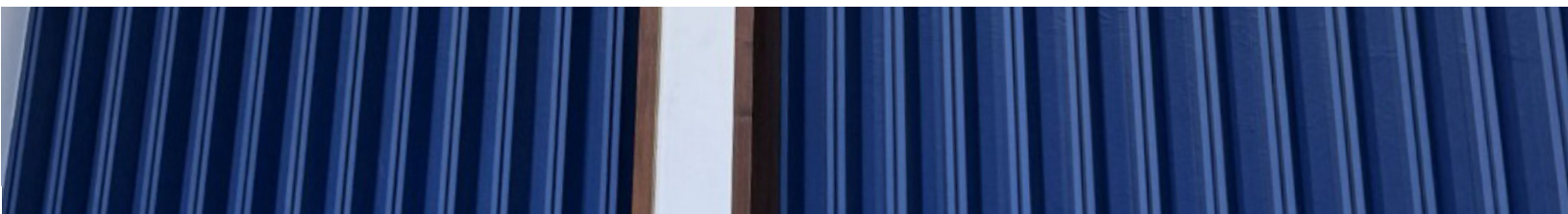

A Letter of Gratitude from The Watts Family

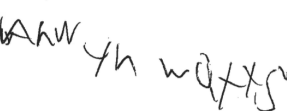

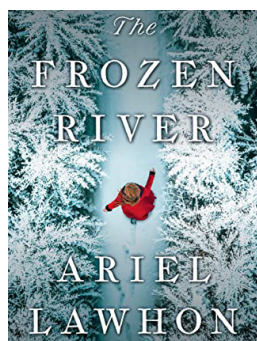

Chapel and Steeple Dedication

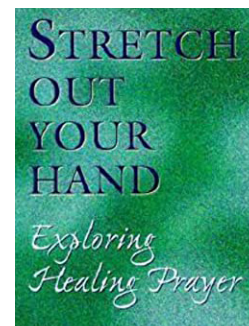
