

Phishing Schemes

Stay Safe from Scams this Holiday Season!

The holiday season is a prime time for scammers, and unfortunately, Naples UCC has recently been targeted by phishing attempts. These scams often involve emails or text messages impersonating Naples UCC ministers, staff, or church officers.

Important Reminder:

No Naples UCC minister, staff member, or church officer will ever ask you via email or text for:

- Personal banking information
- Gift cards
- Sensitive personal data
- Urgent financial assistance

If you receive a suspicious message: **Check the sender's full email address.** Scammers often make small, hard-to-spot changes to legitimate addresses. **Do not respond.** Instead, call the church office at 239-261-5469 to verify authenticity. Your vigilance helps keep our community safe. Thank you for staying alert!
