







New Date : Burrowing Owls, a Threatened Species

Due to an unexpected change in the speaker's schedule, the Burrowing Owls presentation has been rescheduled for January 27. Burrowing owls in Florida are a threatened species, especially in Southwest Florida. This slide presentation will include long-term data and a background on the increasing threats they are facing in a growing urban environment. It will also include information on starter burrows providing supplemental habitat in front yards of willing Collier County homeowners. Whether we can sustain a population moving forward relies a lot on citizen involvement. Join to hear how Brittany Piersma, an Audubon Western Everglades Field Biologist, manages their Shorebirds Stewardship, Burrowing Owls, and the Gopher Tortoise programs.

Annual Meeting




