We are now undergoing an update to the accounting software, preparing the documentation for the upcoming financial audit by the external auditors, and closing out the first quarter. As a result, the publishing of the March financial report will be delayed a few weeks after which the statements will return to the planned cadence.

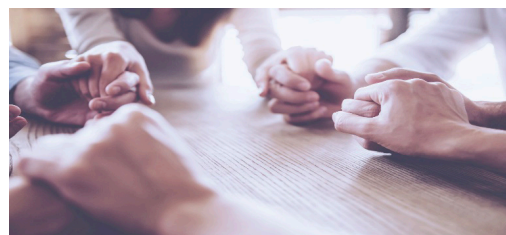
Introduce a Friend to NUCC
