Prevention Champion | Lori Hunt, Vice Mayor, Town of Prescott Valley



I have the privilege of serving as a MATFORCE volunteer. It is probably the most rewarding volunteer position I have ever had. It all started when Nicky Indicavitch, an advocate for kids and mom of four in our local HUSD, met with Mayor Kell Palguta and me. She said that her middle and high school kids were going to their friend's funerals.

In 2020 our County lost five teens to illegal fentanyl poisoning. Of which in Prescott Valley two were 14-year-olds and one 17-year-old. In February 2021 our Prescott Valley Illegal Fentanyl

Working Group was born. We currently meet every other month on the second Wednesday. Please mark you calendar for our next meeting on November 9th at 4pm in the Prescott Valley Library auditorium (7401 Skoog Blvd). This meeting is going to focus on how illegal drugs impact families. Being a volunteer at a coalition is not something I was trained in or could have ever imagined being a part of. I am a retired City Manager and Community/Economic Development Director and didn't have any sort of drug addiction in my family. But let me tell you, the benefit of being pulled out of my comfort zone to do a little for our community and kids is heartwarming. The 2021 Overdose Fatality Review Board Annual Report indicated an 11 percent decrease, first time in five years, in overdose deaths in Yavapai County! Coconino County is the only other county in AZ that showed any decreased. And the same report shows an 80 percent reduction (from 5 in 2020 to 1 in 2021) in teen overdose deaths related to fentanyl. It takes a village to get this sort of success and to educate our community on the dangers of illegal drugs. The good news...We are Saving Lives!"

Community Impact






Before I was arrested, I was homeless for 3 years, addicted to drugs, and really had no motivation to try in my life. With getting out of jail at Camp Verde, I had no idea what I was going to do. But, when I was in jail I got connected with the Reentry Program and within 24 hours time after being released I was in an Oxford House.

Connecting with the right people through the Reentry Program, I got a start with the help I desperately needed. Through the support of the program, I was motivated to make my life better. With the connections I've made and the continued support from the Reentry Program coaching I'm 4 months sober. I have found myself living instead of just watching my life slip by. ~ Michael
