Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) provide critical services to those disproportionately impacted by incidents. They are the food banks, childcare centers, shelters, and houses of worship that make our communities stronger. When CBOs are unable to continue operating, those who rely on them are left vulnerable. CBOs should maintain and improve their abilities to:

- **Prepare for risks** in their communities;
- Develop **emergency plans** for various disaster types; and •
- Understand what is necessary to keep their **doors open** during and after a disaster. •



PREPARING COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS

Community-Based Organizations are often the go-to service providers that families and individuals rely on in times of need. They are one of the first lines of defense that help communities fully respond to and recover from disasters. Without CBOs functioning at their full capacity in times of emergency, marginalized individuals are further exposed to hardship.
