

## 2020 Family Camping Weekend Expectations

We are so excited to welcome your family to this unique opportunity for families to enjoy some Camp St. Charles time together! Due to the coronavirus pandemic and our need to physically distance from one another, we can accommodate a limited number of camp staff and will be able to offer some staff-led summer camp program activities. Additionally, we will have activity times scheduled for families to enjoy on their own.

A schedule will be provided for each family and a rotation planned so that each family can enjoy each activity offered. Each day, Camp Staff will provide 3-4 staff led activities. Family may plan more

We will be serving three (3) meals on Friday, three (3) meals on Saturday, and three (3) meals on Sunday. Additionally, we will provide two (2) daily snacks. For any special dietary needs, please submit the food allergy Google form two weeks prior to attendance.

About your cabin!

1. Each cabin has a color and we will use that color to color code items for your family's use.
2. Each cabin contains many bunk beds and all are new within the last couple of years. Adults may wish to double up camp mattresses to make an extra comfy bunk. Twin size bedding is best for our bunks which are a little narrower than a standard twin.
3. Each cabin has a cubicle which is typically home to a couple of amazing camp counselors. You may wish to use that space for more privacy when changing. The cubicle also has a mini fridge for you to use.
4. Each cabin will have a picnic table and a fire pit. Firewood will be provided.

Camp staff will be available to lead activities, assist with meals, and provide frequent cleaning of shared equipment and restrooms. Families will be supervising their own children, similar to

our visiting day. Saturday night, we will offer a movie night for children age 5+ years old for a parent “date night.” For all other activities, families will enjoy activities together.

Fr Glen hopes to join us for mass on Sundays, if he is unable to provide mass at camp, we will assist families with attending mass at Holy Ghost Catholic Church in Issue, MD, which is just a few miles from camp.
