LETTER FROM Rev. Dr. Leah Hrachovec

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ!

My family and I are eager to share life and faith with you. Alongside you, we will continue to navigate these challenging times amid global and national concerns, changing work life, and as parents, children, and people of faith, believing that Christ claims us, calls us, and helps us respond with generosity, hope, and love. As Paul once wrote to the Romans, whom he had yet to meet, “For I am longing to see you so that I may share with you some spiritual gift to strengthen you— or rather so that we may be mutually encouraged by each other’s faith, both yours and mine.”

In you, I see a vibrant community of people who want to “Know Christ and Make Christ Known.” Transitions in leadership can be challenging, and yet I know from your history that you are a church that has survived and thrived in the midst of change. You understand the importance of living out faith by God’s Word and Spirit, and I appreciate how you have allowed yourself to be reformed during Westminster’s impressive 130 years. Knowing that Christ is our center, may we make Him known – with joy, love, humility, courage and compassion – in the years ahead. The world needs the church only so long as we are the body of Christ together, pointing in word and in deed to the one who unites us, redeems our lives, and transforms the world now and forever.
