Observing with caution.

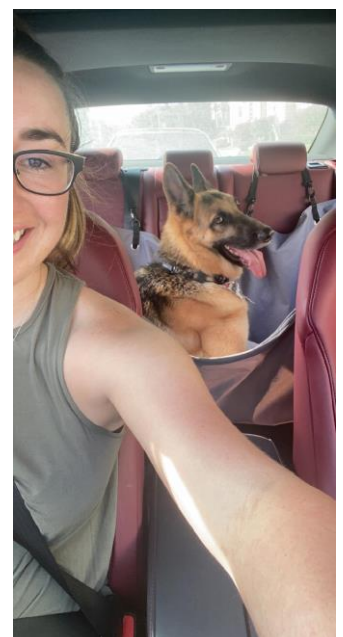
