LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Eckstein Families,

Today we had a fantastic Spirit Assembly, ending our spirit week with a crazy game of 'Hungry Hippo' (ask your student).

Behind the (spirited) scenes, we have been working on our 2019-2020 school budget and staffing. As you are aware, Seattle Public Schools is facing a budget shortfall due to legislative caps on City Levies. This has meant large scale cuts across the district. At Eckstein, we received a lower staffing allocation equating to two teaching positions. Also, we were not funded for our House Administrator or half of the library position.

While these cuts are tough, they are cuts that are being applied across the district. Our Building Leadership Team has worked hard with me on this budget and our current proposed budget will have some reduction in the number of sections offered but will not cut any programming. We will also be able to supplement our librarian to a full-time position. We are not able to supplement the House Administrator position. We are very thankful to our PTSA and families for your continued generosity in supporting classroom materials and supplies each year. This support allows our building funds to supplement our librarian and classroom staffing. If you have more questions regarding the budget or want to help in this effort to support Eckstein's staffing in 2019-2020, please do attend the PTSA meeting on Monday at 7:00 PM in the library.
