BECOMING AMERICANS: 1774

In the spring of 1774, ten men from what would become Montgomery County met at Hungerford's Tavern in Rockville to sign historic resolves to boycott all trade with Britain in response to her brutal retaliation against Boston for the "Tea Party" there in December 1773. Join Sandra Heiler from Montgomery History as she situates those and other men's actions within the broader context of a transition, as American colonists began to see themselves no longer as Englishmen and women, but ultimately as Americans. The talk will focus on the chain of events that led to the Hungerford Resolves, what they agreed to, why they were historic, and what happened next.
