"Becoming Americans: 1774"



In the spring of 1774, ten men from what would become Montgomery County met at Hungerford's Tavern in Rockville to sign historic resolves to boycott all trade with Britain in response to her brutal retaliation against Boston for the "Tea Party" there in December 1773. Join **Sandra Heiler from Montgomery History** as she puts those and other men's actions within the broader context of a transition, as American colonists began to see themselves no longer as Englishmen and women, but ultimately as Americans. The talk will focus on the chain of events that led to the Hungerford Resolves, what they agreed to, why they were historic, and what happened next.

Be wary of online relationships where the person provides little personal info and is vague about critical aspects of their lives.

Get a call from a loved one in trouble? Verify it with a 'safe word' you've agreed on before. AI can do amazing imitations!

Never give money or personal info to solicitors who come to your door. Contribute through the organization's website instead.

Check phone numbers against the official website (be careful!!) of an organization. Don't use links you are given.

Double check email addresses (hover the cursor over the name in the email headings) to make sure it's actually from the right group—a weird address means it's fake!

When in doubt, verify the source!
