



Conversion or transformation is a change of mind and heart, this commitment is expressed not in a single action, nor even in several actions over time, but in an entire way of life. It means committing one's very self to the Lord.

Stewardship is an expression of your commitment and faith in the God, with the power to change how you understand and live out your life. As a disciple of Jesus, when you practice stewardship you recognize God as the origin of life, the giver of freedom, the source of all you HAVE, ARE, and WILL BE. You become fully and deeply aware of the truth that: *"The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it."* (Ps 24:1).

In other words, you realize you are a recipient and caretaker of God's many gifts. Followers of Jesus are grateful for what they have received and eager to cultivate their gifts out of love for God and one another. Generous sharing of resources, including money, is central to its practice, and church support is a necessary part of this.

Essentially, it means helping the Church's mission with money, time, and personal resources of all kinds. This sharing is not an option for Christians who understand what membership in the Church (the Body of Christ) involves. It is a serious duty and privilege. It is a consequence and fulfillment of the faith which Christians profess and celebrate.
