THE OFFERTORY

I was glad C.H.H. Parry (1848-1918)

TEXT: I was glad when they said unto me, we will go into the house of the Lord. Our feet shall stand in thy gates, O Jerusalem. Jerusalem is builded as a city that is at unity in itself. O pray for the peace of Jerusalem, they shall prosper that love thee. Peace be within thy walls, and plenteousness within thy palaces. (Ps.122)

This text has been used at Coronations of the English Monarchy since 1626. This version by Charles Parry was first used in 1902 for King Edward VII, and has been used ever since then by succeeding monarchs – including, most recently, Charles III. The middle section includes a powerful musical setting of the Latin for “LONG LIVE THE KING/QUEEN” – but it is only ever sung when the English Monarch is present. Andrew was present at such an occasion in 1969 at the Royal Albert Hall for the 40th Anniversary of the founding of the Royal School of Church Music.
