Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.”

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.



HYMN NOTES: A famous American patriotic and abolitionist hymn written by Julia Ward Howe in November 1861 and published in The Atlantic Monthly in February 1862. Howe adapted the lyrics from the earlier Union marching song "John Brown's Body," which itself was set to a melody derived from the 18th-century Methodist camp meeting hymn "Say, Brothers, Will You Meet Us" (also known as "Canaan's Happy Shore"), composed by William Steffe around 1855.

Howe, a prominent abolitionist, was inspired to write the new lyrics after hearing Union troops sing "John Brown's Body" during a review of troops near Washington, D.C. Her version transformed the song from a gritty military chant into a profound theological statement, linking the Union cause directly with divine justice and the abolition of slavery. The hymn quickly became a morale booster for the North and remains a significant cultural symbol of American history, frequently associated with the Civil War, social justice movements, and religious revivalism.
