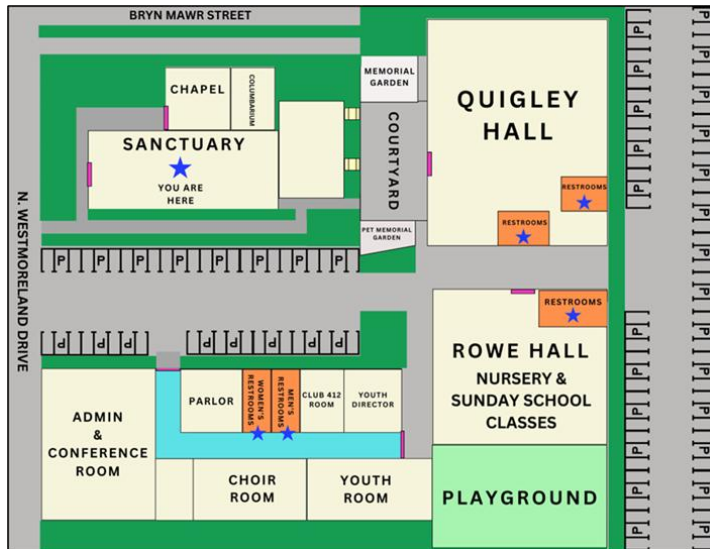

OPENING HYMN NOTES: another well-known hymn, one of the many we sing acknowledging Jesus as "Shepherd", that has been with us for almost 200 years. Words by a Dorothy Ann Thrupp (1779-1847), first found in the book "Hymns for the Young, 4th edition" (1836). Thrupp lived her whole life in London, England, especially noted for the hymns she wrote for children. The tune for "Savior, like a shepherd lead us" was composed by William Bradbury and published in his Sunday school collection Oriola in 1859 – written specifically for this text. He is best known as the composer of the FAMOUS tune for "Jesus loves me, this I know"!

FIRST READING

ACTS 9:36-43

All sit.

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

**** HYMN NOTE:** this is one of the many songs we sing at St. Michael's from the Iona Community. Much of their material is based on Folks Songs that have been sung by The People for hundreds of years – but they replace the original text with a sacred text. Worship leaders in the community have also contributed original material. The best of this material is characterized by an immediacy of appeal, and contemporary language and themes that speak to the people of the 20th and 21st centuries.

The Iona Community was founded in 1938 by George MacLeod, a minister of the Church of Scotland in Govan, Glasgow. MacLeod aimed to bridge the gap between the church and working people by taking a group of ministers and unemployed workers to Iona to rebuild the ruined medieval Iona Abbey together. The original monastery on the island of Iona, on the west coast of Scotland, was founded in 563 by the monk Columba, and was the scene of several Viking raids from the 700's on


COMPOSER NOTES: Malcolm Benjamin Graham Christopher Williamson was an Australian composer known for his prolific output and versatility in various musical genres. Born on November 21, 1931, in Sydney, Australia, he moved to London in 1950 to further his musical studies and made England his permanent home in 1953. Williamson was the Master of the Queen's Music from 1975 until his death in 2003. Musicians often put together several activities to put a roof over their heads, Malcolm Williamson was no different: upon moving to London he labored as a church organist, proofreader, and a nightclub pianist!





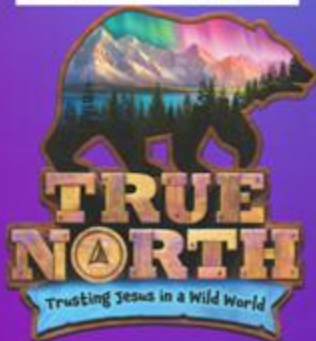

Dear St. Michael's Family,

Thank you for your kind, generous, and gracious expressions of love, encouragement, and support as Katrena and I prepare to enter our extended Sabbath after Easter Sunday. Clergy in the Episcopal Church are encouraged to take a sabbatical every five to seven years. As I enter my 20th year as a priest, this is my first "official sabbatical", and I am privileged to take some time for renewal, and it will be good for my soul, the soul of my marriage and family, and the soul of my ministry.

HERE ARE OUR PLANS:

RESTORATION: Katrena and I will spend several weeks in the Italian countryside. Our intentions are to avoid the major tourist areas and spend time visiting small villages and simply relaxing and being together. The place we've chosen to stay in is a former monastery that has been converted into apartments and is somewhat secluded which will allow for quiet walks, reflection, prayer, and solitude-- along with good wine and delicious Italian food!

RENEWAL: A week after we return home, I leave by myself for the rolling hills of Kentucky for an intensive workshop tailored for behavioral health professionals and clergy. I will spend eight days in a remote and rustic setting with seven other people and a team of assisting professionals who will lead the group into deep soul work. The spiritual and emotional work will be intense, but I know it will bring me even closer and more deeply connected to God and my true self.

RECONNECTING: In the remaining time, we intend a few overdue family visits in North Carolina, and perhaps West Virginia.... (And I MAY even wash my car and clean my garage.)

Freddy Clayton, our Senior Warden, will oversee leading Vestry meetings. Ashleigh will continue to assist in the daily administrative operations. Fr. Greg will lead the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. Joan will work with Freddy, Ashleigh, and Fr. Greg in the business and financial life of St. Michael's.

Again, thank you for your love, prayers, and support. I also want to thank our dedicated staff and vestry for their leadership in my absence. God is doing something amazing and beautiful in the life of St. Michael's and I cannot wait to return in July with fresh perspectives and renewed energy for ministry and what God has in store for us!
