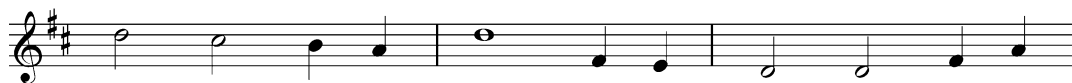

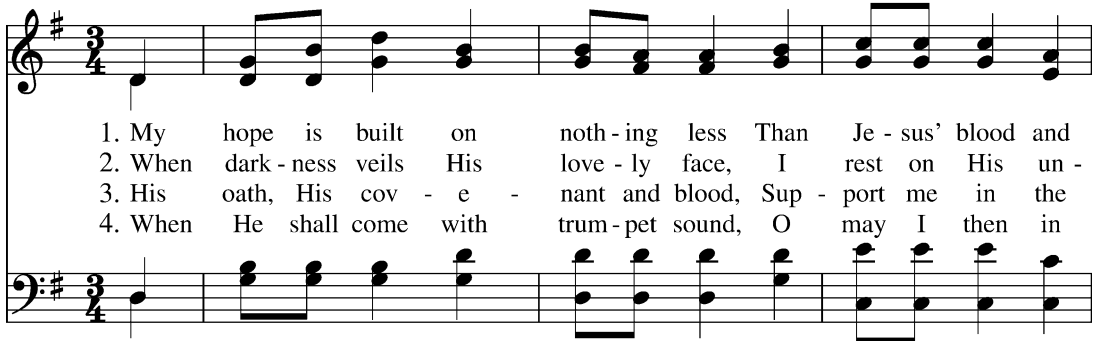

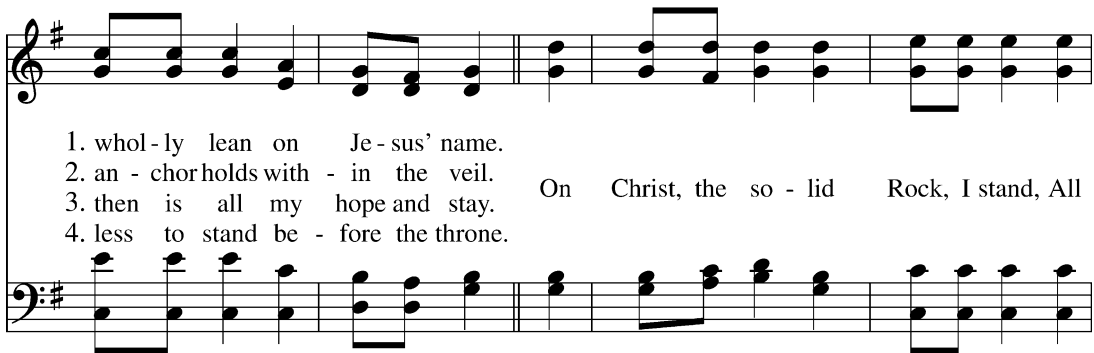

## NICENE CREED

Give wisdom to the leaders of our nation and the nations of the world. Renew their minds, soften their hearts, and give them courage to seek not merely what is popular or powerful, but what serves the common good, especially the poor, the forgotten, and the vulnerable.

**Transform us by your love.**

Draw near to those carrying burdens we cannot see, those who are sick, grieving, lonely, anxious, exhausted, or afraid. Surround them with your mercy, and remind them that nothing they face can place them beyond the reach of your love. We remember especially those we name before you now. {LIST}

**Transform us by your love.**

We remember before you those we love but see no longer. {PAUSE} Receive them into the fullness of your mercy, where sorrow is ended, death is no more, and love is made complete. Comfort all who grieve, and keep us in the hope that in Christ, nothing, not even death, can separate us from your love.

**Transform us by your love.**

**Priest:** Merciful God, you have loved us with a love we did not earn and surrounded us with a mercy we could never deserve. Renew our minds, transform our hearts, and offer our lives back to you, until the life of Jesus becomes visible in us and wherever we go, your love goes with us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

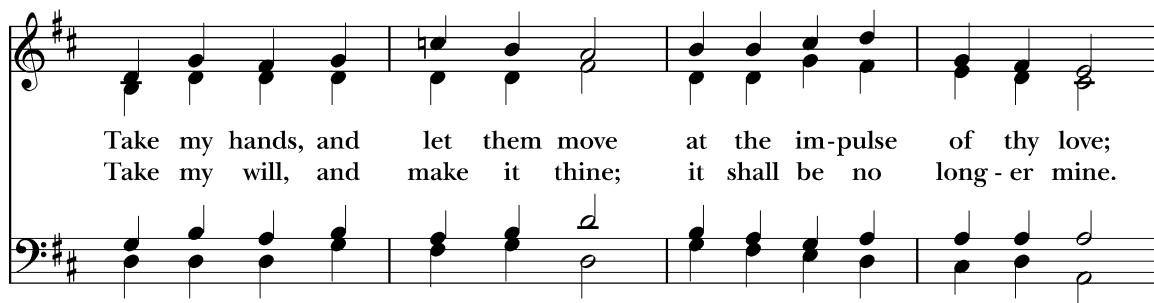
