



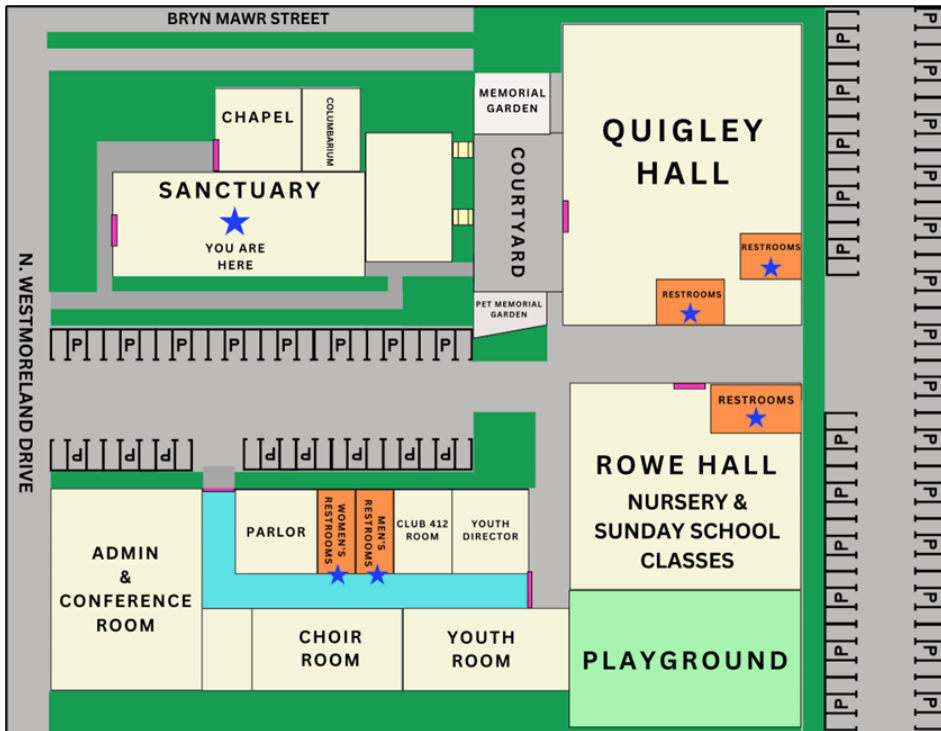

FIRST READING

Acts 1:6-14

When the apostles had come together, they asked Jesus, “Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?” He replied, “It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.”

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day’s journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

If you are reviled for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory, which is the Spirit of God, is resting on you.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Intercessor: In this Easter season, as we hear Jesus pray for his disciples and for the world he loves, let us bring before God the needs of the Church, the world, and our own hearts, saying:
O Christ, draw near to us.

For the Church throughout the world, that we may not merely speak about eternal life, but live it, knowing the only true God and Jesus Christ whom he has sent; that our worship, compassion, and witness may reveal the love of Christ to a weary and divided world.

For all who feel disconnected, lonely, or unseen; for those who long to know that their life matters and that they themselves are deeply loved; that through the Holy Spirit they may discover the eternal life Jesus speaks of, a life rooted not merely in survival, but in communion with you.

O Christ, draw near to us.

For those burdened by illness, and for all who are carrying struggles known only to you; {LIST} that your healing presence may bring light into places of fear and hope into places of despair.

O Christ, draw near to us.

For those who have died, and for those who mourn them, remembering especially those we now name silently or aloud. {PAUSE} That they may rest in the eternal love of the risen Christ, who prays even now that we may be one with him forever.

O Christ, draw near to us.

Celebrant: Living God, your Son Jesus prayed that we might know you and discover in you the fullness of life. Gather us more deeply into your love, free us from all that keeps us isolated from you and one another, and teach us to live even now the eternal life revealed in Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**





HYMN NOTES: The text of this hymn is based on Revelation 19:12, which describes Christ having "many diadems" (crowns) on His head, written by Matthew Bridges in 1851. Bridges was a convert to Roman Catholicism from the Church of England, several verses including references to the Virgin Mary. In 1871, additional verses were written for this hymn by the Anglican priest, Godfrey Thring. Most hymnals today use text selected from both writers to bridge theological traditions while maintaining its focus on Christ's sovereignty and sacrifice.

The hymn's tune, "Diademata" (Greek for "crowns"), was composed by George J. Elvey in 1868 specifically for this text. Elvey, the long-time organist and choirmaster at St. George's Chapel, Windsor, composed the music to convey a sense of royalty and dignity, fitting for a coronation-style hymn – often used for the Feast of Ascension, the Sunday following, and Christ the King Sunday. The tune first appeared in the United States in the American College Hymnal, 1876.
