



Tails are wagging in anticipation of the 13th Annual Paws for Peace Walk & Run!

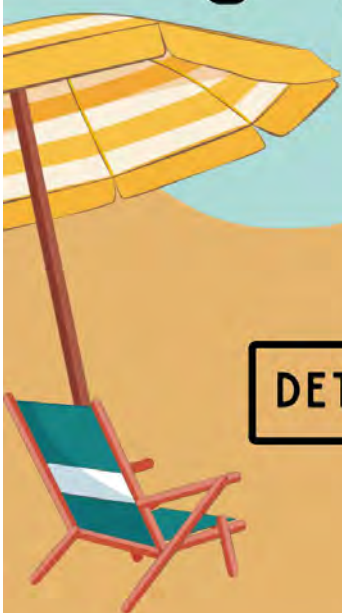
