

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. 



In case you haven't heard the GOOD NEWS, St Michael's is getting a **brand new, state-of-the-art Audio & Video system!** Funds were generously given specifically for this purpose and the process is now in progress! Now, more than ever, this is a huge gift as we have so many people watching our services on YouTube each week. Lead-times for certain components have lengthened, but we are hopeful to have the system installed in November, prior to the start of the Advent season.



For those of you watching St Michael's Services on YouTube, thank you for bearing with us over the last several weeks. There was a lightning strike near the church on the evening of Saturday, August 21st that took out several pieces of our streaming gear. It took several days of troubleshooting to figure out what got zapped and several more days to get something temporary in place. We are still working to tweak the settings and you should see an improvement in the stream as we get used to the temporary gear. We are now in discussions with our AV contractor to see if our new video gear can be installed prior to the new audio gear.
